2. What role does Rugby League play for your students?

Sport is a really important part of many kid's education. It builds a huge range of skills and attributes that assist their development as young adults and members of the community. Rugby League is a great sport at building teamwork and resilience. It allows students to engage with each other, teachers and the community in a different way than the classroom provides. For some students it is the primary engagement tool to get them to school regularly. It's an important part of building our young men and women as quality members of the community.

3. What's your favourite school Rugby League moment?

I've been lucky to have supportive principals along my journey as a rugby league coach, trainer, manager and administrator. So I've had plenty of amazing experiences - our Cairns State High School Girls Rugby League team going to Redcliffe last year and winning the Karen Murphy Cup stands out. The whole experience was amazing, and the support the NRL gave was fantastic.

4. What's your favourite general Rugby League moment or experience?

As university students in Brisbane, we used to love going every year to state of origin at Lang Park, they had student tickets. It was one of my best mates Luke's birthday (who now teaches in Ayr), and we bought him a Qld jersey. They picked 3 people out of the crowd in jerseys (2 QLDers and 1 NSW supporter). They picked Luke and another one of our group Greg for the halftime competition catching bombs. Luke and Greg caught every bomb, including Luke taking a diving full length catch in front of 40000 screaming QLDers. Not a pure footy moment but it was pretty amazing experience.
