INSTRUCTIONS

1. Colour or paint the poppy template red.
2. Carefully cut out your template.
3. Colour the dot black or glue a black bean to middle of the flower.
4. Glue a green pipe cleaner to the back of the flower or carefully use a safety pin to attached it to your shirt. It gets pinned on the left side of your chest.
